
## **Monero UI Proposal**


The current GUI has specific issues and general issues that need to be addressed. It can also use better artifacts to depict certain functionality. The current GUI implementation can be used as a baseline. As many components are being reused in the proposal.

#### **Problem 1**

Layout scheme is not ideal for desktop or mobile



Currently the responsive layout implementation hides the navigation completely. This results in situations where browsing the app has serious friction. It takes time to understand how the menu on top works.



With this menu scheme, the left navigation is always on the left on desktop. If the screen is really on a mobile phone, then switches the icons to a lower navigation. The most well known and tested navigation pattern on mobile.



#### **Problem 2**


The transaction history is most of the times and in most wallets one of the main parts of the homepage of an experience. We can see the recent Activity being an integral part of the main landing page of most wallets (Electrum, Copay, Exodus, Jaxx, etc)



Transaction history on the GUI could be simplified for the average user. And we can add more details, in the details section of the transaction. I dont see a reason for not having a simple list of incoming/outgoing transactions.

Below there is a sample of a simple list item. Expanding to show more details. But as default, just showing sent/receive, date and amount.

Common strategy on most wallets




All the filtering settings on top can also be hidden by default, this is certainly advanced functionality that makes the UI more daunting for novice users.

Right now the GUI has "Send" as default and landing state. Which might not be the most expected place to the regular user of crypto wallets.


#### **Problem 3**




### **Problem 4**




Transaction List Items, Account List items, and Sub-Addresses (missing comp) should have the same type of list items.

### **Problem 5**



# **Simpler Transaction History**


This is the proposal for simplified transaction list items.
