- Huawei – now integrated with Jenkins and we're able to do bare metal testing of ARM again! (Thanks Adrian)
- Lenovo – Caesar working on getting new servers back up after a power outage and hope to be added as self-hosted GitHub runners this month

Release Updates and Naming Conventions

- EL 9.2 with WW3
 - X86_64 passes all tests
 - ARM 900+ tests passing
- openSUSE Leap 15.5 with WW3
 - ARM short tests passing (100+ tests) and long tests started
 - X86_64 needs patches from Adrian to WW3 onto the TACC-hosted CI before testing
- openEuler
 - ARM passing all tests ethernet only but one (openpbs with extrae)
 - x86_64 booting
- WW4 support is still under development
